

LITERACY

The Foundation Literacy Program focuses on the development of Reading, Writing and Language skills. Students develop early reading behaviours by engaging with a variety of entertaining and informative texts featuring familiar and new vocabulary. Students participate in shared language experiences to develop their oral language skills and learn early writing strategies in order to say, draw and write their ideas.

NUMERACY

The Foundation Numeracy program covers curriculum areas such as Number, Measurement and Data. Students develop an early understanding of mathematical concepts and skills and apply these to solve problems and make sense of the world around them.

INQUIRY

Students collaborate, create and inquire into authentic units of study linked to all areas of the Victorian Curriculum.





RESPECTFUL RELATIONSHIPS

Students learn and practice social skills and apply them in a positive way to learning, life and relationships.

PE - specialist

Students develop the movement skills, concepts and strategies necessary to participate in a variety of physical activities and sports.





SCIENCE - specialist

Students develop inquiring minds and curiosity about the natural world and acquire knowledge, conceptual understanding and skills to solve scientific problems.

Through visual and performing arts, students creatively express their ideas, experiences and identities.






ITALIAN
